

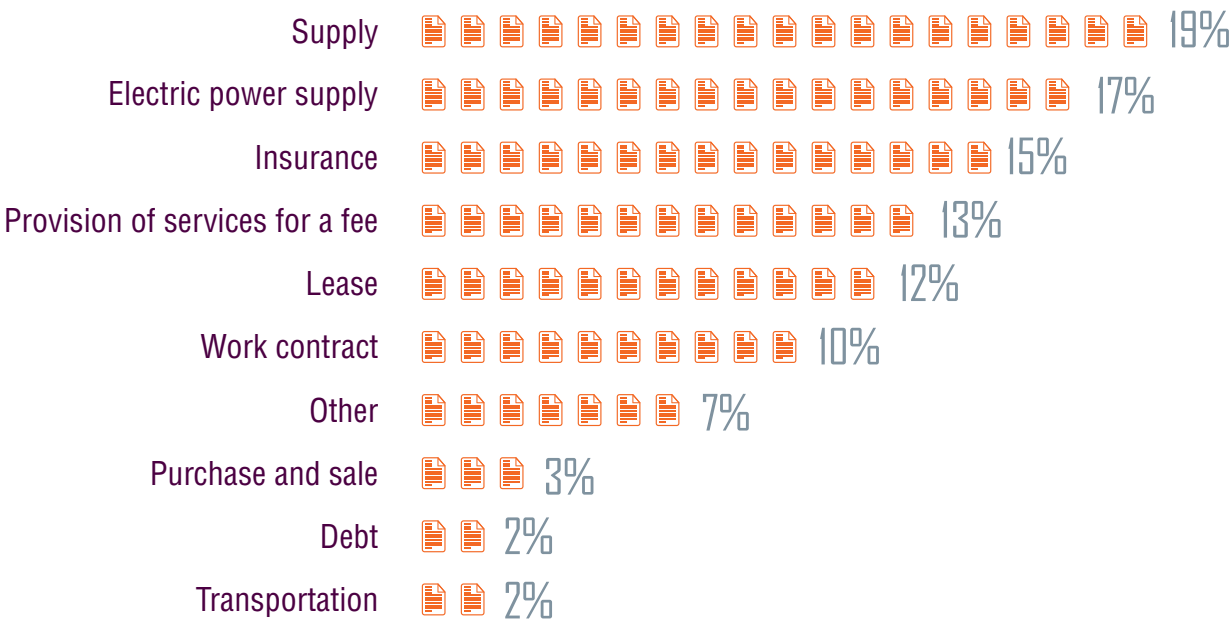

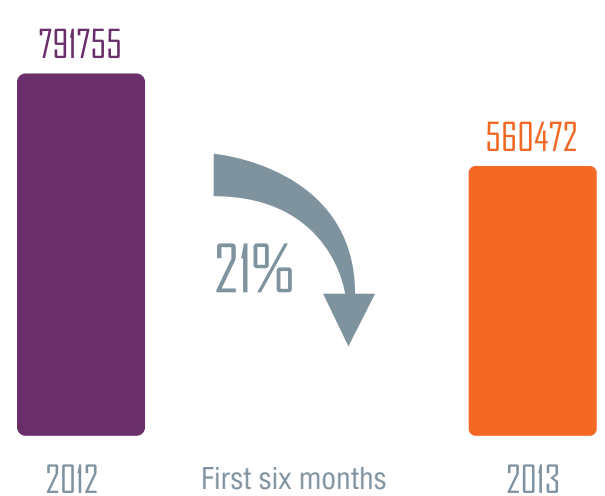
Most common disputes heard in the courts



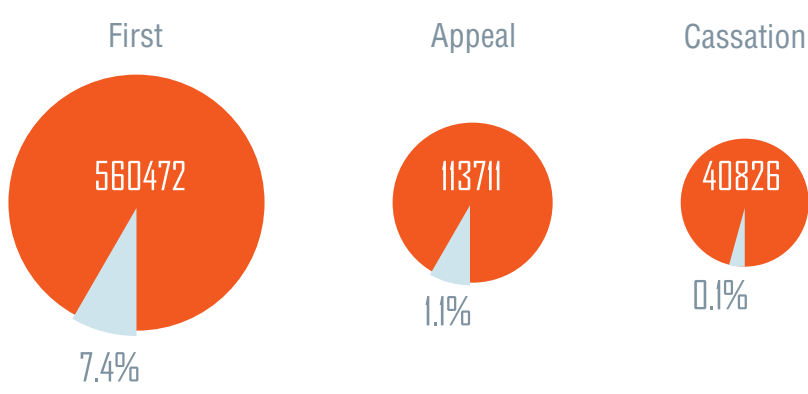
Contracts most commonly challenged



Total number of cases considered



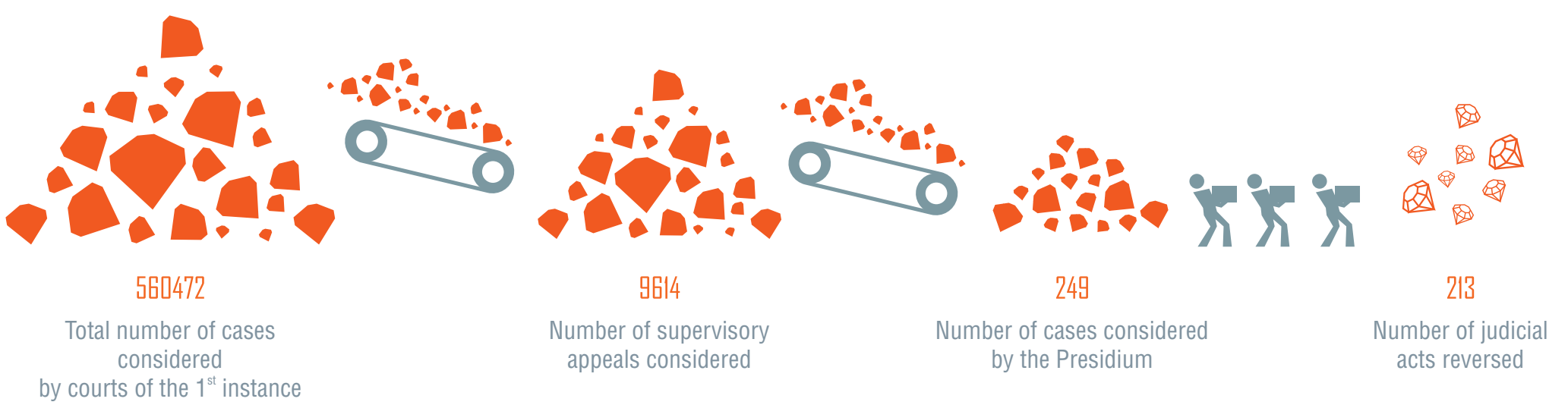
Number of cases considered out of time



Number of judicial acts reversed on appeal under cassation procedures

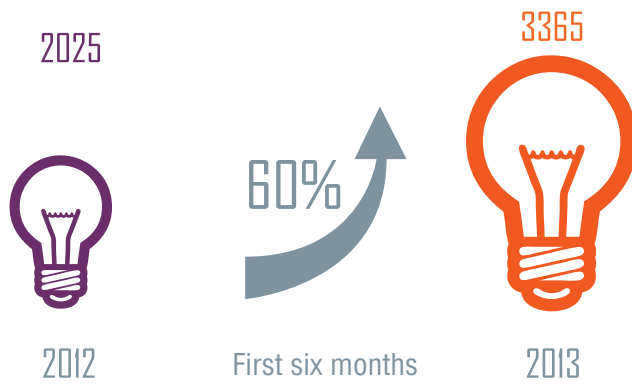

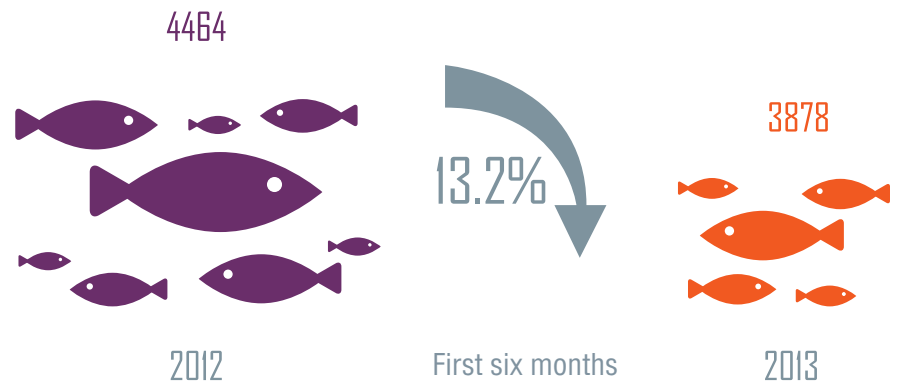


Number of cases considered by courts of the first instance

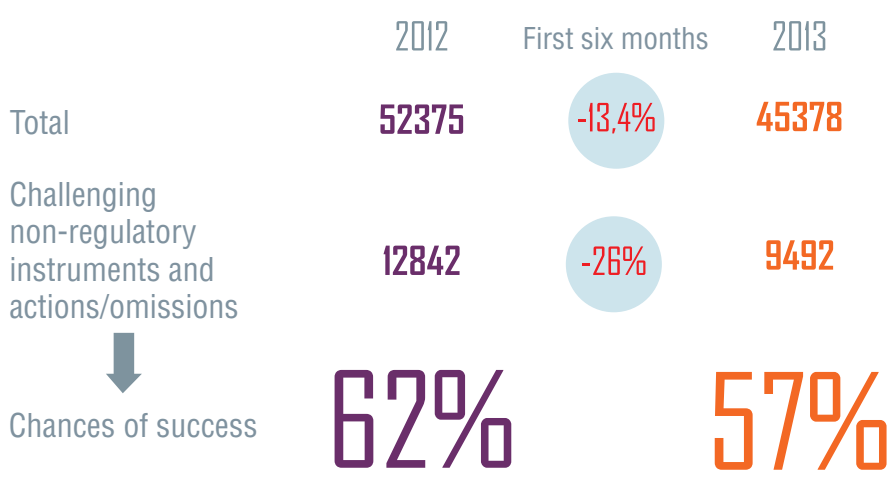

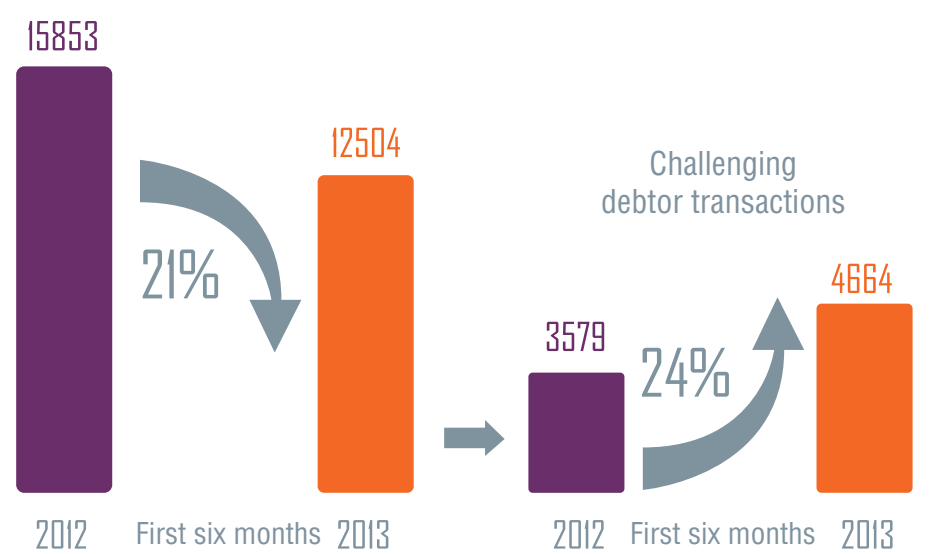

The number of cases arising out of administrative legal relations has decreased more than twofold

Disputes involving the assistance of commercial court assessors are almost zero

Arbitration cases involving IP (Intellectual Property) issues have grown by a total of more than 60%

The number of small disputes about arrears in payment by the Pension Fund has continued to decrease

The number of cases considered under summary proceedings has increased almost tenfold

TOP 10 trends*

The percentage of reversals for cases submitted for consideration by the Presidium of the Supreme Commercial Court remains unchanged at about 85%

The number of claims upheld concerning the return of unduly collected/overpaid taxes from the budget remains at about fifty percent

The number of transactions contested by court-appointed receivers in bankruptcy processes has increased by more than one-third

The number of cases involving a foreign element remains consistently low, no more than 0.2% of the total number of cases

A maximum of 3% of all supervisory appeals are submitted for consideration by the Presidium of the Supreme Commercial Court

Bonus from KIAP – The number of cases where the parties have used their right to collect legal expenses is growing exponentially**
